Outreach Overview

Dates: July 17-19, 2019

Locations: As Travesas Sports Hall, Vigo & Hotel Axis, Vigo

Format: Outreach booth at the competition venue, informal conversations at competition venue and hotel

Materials: Anti-Doping educational resources (pamphlets), Play True Quiz and business cards to open line of communication for further contact and questions

Observations

Australia

- Mandatory for team to undergo ASADA anti-doping education before the tournament
- Assistant coach receptive to information

Bahrain

- Spoke to team physiotherapist and coaches – receptive to information, took our materials
- Some interest from players, high-level

Brazil

- Spoke to athletes at the hotel, somewhat of a language barrier with one teammate translating for the rest of the team
- Very receptive overall – listened to our mini-presentation and took materials

Egypt

- Handed out pamphlets to athletes
- Minimal interaction, some curiosity and interest

France

- Spoke to head coach and shared some information + pamphlets
- Good overall reception, especially with no language barrier

Korea

- Spoke to coach, not very receptive (most likely due to language barrier)
- Minimal interaction with the athletes

Observations

Kosovo

- Spoke to team coach (2000 Olympian), very receptive to our information and expressed need for his athletes to have in-depth anti-doping education
- Tried to set up a presentation for the entire team but did not work due to schedule – potential to consider short presentations for individual teams in the future

Nigeria

- Coach gathered the entire team for a brief presentation
- Good overall reaction, some athletes asked to check specific products on GlobalDro

Spain

- Spoke to medical staff and coaches
- Medical staff expressed some concerns over testing process – unrelated to educational outreach but an opportunity for us to share important information
- More receptive as we spoke Spanish

Sweden

- Head coach less receptive to information
- Some high-level interaction with the athletes (i.e. giving away pamphlets)

Tunisia

- Limited interaction – handed out some information
- Some brief conversations but mostly high level

United States of America

- Most interaction with staff rather than athletes
- Overall good knowledge of anti-doping – athletes and staff undergo mandatory education with USADA
